B. Background

Reflection is a fascinating physical image, which is the duplication of noumenon while in a reverse way. That's why it's always used as the metaphor between mirroring images with the speculation between images and invisible subjects. Mirroring image tends to be used in different forms of art to present this fascinating connection.

Sabine Melchior-Bonnet believed that in Greek philosophy the mirror can aid moral meditation between man and himself and mirror and also can be a tool by which to "know thyself," invited man to not mistake himself for God, to avoid pride by knowing his limits, and to improve himself.

In the mythology of narcissus, it's the similiar advice which was given in Greek philosophy. Also, in a lot of literature, this kind of religious meaning of mirroring image plays a significant role.

While in paintings, painters may use this tool to remind of the relationship between the watcher and the watched such as mirrors in Jan van Eyck's the Arnolfini Portrait and Diego Velázquez's Las Meninas.

When turning into the territory of architecture, how to play with physical and mental reflection and represent this metaphor between them would be a interesting point.

This metaphor between mirroring images and speculation is widely used in different fields especially when referring to how human being understand objects similiar to themselves.

If in a more intellectural context, reflection also refers to some social activities such as conversation with others, reading a book, watching a movie and so on.

When this kind of metaphor between physical and mental reflections is being inspired in diferent architectural ways, there is a chance to reflect on images which are created from the routine itself rather than turning a blind eye to the routine.

Reflection

1. Through what we see reflections?

Reflections, if putting it more physically, could be seen as mirroring images. Anything whose optic property is reflectible could present mirroring images in front of us. The tricky thing is that while these images reflect the true world, they may be fuzzy or deformed. So if we look through the history how people make use of reflections we will find that at the first half it can be said as a history of finding an approach to the cleanest reflection. When this goal was accomplished, then the essence of a 'mirror' drifted into a more profound way to observe cosmic and quantum world. That's also when we get used to the 'normal' mirroring images, after all, when somthing became a part of routines, how could it amazes someone?

However, getting used to somthing doesn't mean that can't be something. If we spare some time, stop and stare, can we still notice our reflections?

- Mirror

The most normal way to see reflections. Every day in the moring, almost every one would have a glance at him/herself in the mirror so to be ready for a new day. Naturally the mirror would be parallelly placed at the rough height of our eyes while when at an unusual place images in the mirror would be unusual too.

- Water

The oldest way to see reflections. Our ancestors saw themselves for the first time on the surface of water. With its transparency and deformability, reflections on water come along with mysteries.

- Glass

2. What and who got involved in reflections?

If recalling what are there in reflections, if the medium changes, it seems things got involved in reflectiona varies along with them.

In usual ways, in mirrors there are almost identical and reversal images of objects, which are often those who are facing mirrors. While in the water, reflections are always related to something independent with obsevers and in this kind of situations reflections and what they reflect tend to fuse together to make up the sceneary. Then the most 'modern' way, while at the same time, the most frequent way in the modern world, is seeing reflections in glass. Those hard and magnificent glass are fundamental to a modern architecture as the role of windows of buildings. So it is very fascinating to observe reflections in glass because they are always mixed with things inside of the building and things outside surrounding the observer.

He then justifies that emphasis upon man's inward rather than outward concerns, even in visual art, by saying that it is in his soul that man resembles the Deity: "the soul of man is still a mirror, where in may be seen, darkly, the image of the mind of God." ¹

3. Reflections: Truth or not?

Actually, reflections tend to be related to the metaphor of knowing oneself. This is about how we perceive the reality and virtual reality and also the border between them. This process refers to a psychological term: narcissism, which is about how we perceive ourselves and how we consider the relationship between ourselves and the world.

Like in the myth called Narcissus, this beautiful, pride young man fell in love with his reflection in the river as the punishment for his pride and prejudice. Here are three points in this story: the most ancient way to get the image of the subject is looking in the water; this young man was punished beceuse of his pride; and the last the most important thing is confusing reality and the images of reality is a hopeless punishment in this story.

So when we have a second look at reflections, to some extent it reflects truth while it isn't truth itself. If taking it as the whole truth, this ancient mythology already told us the result. While the other thing is, in virtue of the reflection of oneself, it is possible to observe the observant subject as the observed object. Whether being indulged or being detached, this kind of process implies the chance to clarify the inside and the outside. If well used, however, the mirror can aid moral meditation between man and himself. Socrates, we are told by Diogenes, urged young people to look at themselves in mirrors so that, if they were beautiful, they would become worthy of their beauty, and if they were ugly, they would know how to hide their disgrace through learning. The mirror, a tool by which to "know thyself," invited man to not mistake himself for God, to avoid pride by knowing his limits, and to improve himself. His was thus not a passive mirror of imitation but an active mirror of transformation.¹

There was an unclouded fountain, with silver-bright water, which neither shepherds nor goats grazing the hills, nor other flocks, touched, that no animal or bird disturbed not even a branch falling from a tree. Grass was around it, fed by the moisture nearby, and a grove of trees that prevented the sun from warming the place. Here, the boy, tired by the heat and his enthusiasm for the chase, lies down, drawn to it by its look and by the fountain. While he desires to quench his thirst, a different thirst is created. While he drinks he is seized by the vision of his reflected form. He loves a bodiless dream. He thinks that a body, that is only a shadow. He is astonished by himself, and hangs there motionless, with a fixed expression, like a statue carved from Parian marble.

Flat on the ground, he contemplates two stars, his eyes, and his hair, fit for Bacchus, fit for Apollo, his youthful cheeks and ivory neck, the beauty of his face, the rose-flush mingled in the whiteness of snow, admiring everything for which he is himself admired. Unknowingly he desires himself, and the one who praises is himself praised, and, while he courts, is courted, so that, equally, he inflames and burns. How often he gave his lips in vain to the deceptive pool, how often, trying to embrace the neck he could see, he plunged his arms into the water, but could not catch himself within them! What he has seen he does not understand, but what he sees he is on fire for, and the same error both seduces and deceives his eyes.

Fool, why try to catch a fleeting image, in vain? What you search for is nowhere: turning away, what you love is lost! What you perceive is the shadow of reflected form: nothing of you is in it. It comes and stays with you, and leaves with you, if you can leave! ²

1. Las Meninas, Diego Velázquez, 1656

He achieved this goal by a simple way, using a mirror in the painting. When looking at this painting, one could consider that he or she as the imperial couple or someone watching the couple watching the painter painting. This is also realted to the speculation mentioned before, whether the reflection is true or not. And also, the watcher inside of the painting also reminds people the behavior of watching.

2. The garden of the master of nets, Qing Dynasty

A reflection of what? Of the real thing—of the art of Velázquez. In the presence of his divinely ordained monarchs ... Velázquez exults in his artistry and counsels Philip and Maria not to look for the revelation of their image in the natural reflection of a looking glass but rather in the penetrating vision of their master painter. In the presence of Velázquez, a mirror image is a poor imitation of the real. ¹
